Criticism of individual Councillor actions

There was a discussion during which the Chairman supported members who had been criticized, clarified his own approach during the meeting in August 2005 and confirmed his view of the Parish Council as maintaining the social integrity of the Parish.

Upon the Chairman's invitation the Clerk confirmed advice previously given that questions could be asked only of the Council and not individual Councillors; minutes of the Police Authority Community Forum were not routinely circulated to Councillors and that the agreed minutes of the Council need only contain the decisions of the Council.

Further points raised included -

Strong praise of Parish Council's general record

The use of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to obtain information.

Failure of the Council to congratulate the RACS group for its success

The difference between the reports of representatives and the minutes of the Police Authority Community Forum minutes of January 2006.

During the ensuing discussion reference was made by Councillors to concerns about the behaviour of some residents towards Councillors. Reference was also made to the wish by some, to continue debating issues that had already been concluded. If there was continued public concern about individual Councillor actions, then recourse could be made to The Standards Board for England or though the normal election process.

Appn 06/0707 Tower Villa, Rickerby – Erection of conservatory – resolved to comment that the location of the conservatory was unclear from the information provided.

Appn 06/0743 Land adjacent road, The Knells, Houghton – Outline Planning permission for new care home facility with car parking and water treatment plant. Resolved to object to the application for the following reasons:-

Firstly supporting the view of residents that -

- 1. The proposed development is in open countryside outside the defined boundary of any settlement.
- 2. The site is an important open space between the separate communities of Townfoot and the Knells
- 3. A unique wildlife habitat has evolved over many years. This would be lost with any development of the land
- 4. The site is very wet and there is regular flooding of the adjacent road
- 5. There are major concerns about sewage disposal as there are problems with existing soakaways
- 6. There would be major adverse impact upon the environmental and residential amenity of the surrounding landscape and property.

- 7. Any development would set a precedent and may attract more applications for adjacent land which would destroy the identity of the settlements of The Knells and Townfoot.
- 8. The adjacent road is not suitable to support the proposed development. There are no footpaths for pedestrians and visibility for exits is limited. The increase in traffic arising from the development would have a major detrimental impact on road safety and upon the environmental amenity of the area

Secondly the view of the Parish Council:-

The proposal is contrary to Policy H1 of Carlisle District Local Plan Redeposit Draft

It is understood that there is a surplus of care home places in the Carlisle area; furthermore that only 60 to 70 care home places are needed for the entire Carlisle area over the next few years. The Knells therefore could not sustain the need for such a large development on its own.

- 1. Public transport through The Knells is limited to twice per day at off peak times. The proposal is, therefore, unsustainable in that regard
- 2. The adjacent road is a 'C' classification and unsuitable to support the development
- 3. Without land suitability studies and site plans no comments can be made on the development itself. It appears to go beyond that needed for the area and cannot be sustained by the local site and road infrastructure.
- 4. The proposed development may be roughly equated with a 70 bedroom hotel including all ancillary provisions and services. A development of such magnitude, especially when proposed for such a site, cannot be properly considered as an outline application. A fully detailed application including all required drawings and suitability studies should be demanded

Appn 06/0783 Houghton Hall Garden Centre, Houghton – display of illuminated and non-illuminated signage

Resolved to object to the application for the following reasons:-

- 1. The proposed signage is contrary to Policy E48 Areas of Special Control, of the Carlisle District Local Plan and Policy EC17 Areas of Special Control of Advertisements, of the Carlisle District Local Plan Redeposit Draft.
- 2. The council wishes to see a consistent and fair approach to signage in the area. The above policies were strictly applied to applications:
 - 04/1396 Display of pole mounted sign St John's Church, Houghton (on the outskirts of the village)

- Parish Councils should recognise that, due to their size, Cumbria County Council and Carlisle City Council lack the administrative agility of Parish Councils.
- Parish Councils should where practicable have a standard procedure, including arrangements for delegation, which enable the council to respond within consultation deadlines etc.
- There were likely to be few Quality Parishes the City Council should treat all Parish Councils equally.
- The City and County Councils should agree on a single reception point for the reception of incidents.
- Section E para 3 should be amended to indicate that Parish Councils have every right to disagree with Principle Authority decisions and may, if they consider it necessary resort to any appeal procedure, redress, or legal remedy.
- Parish Councils should undertake to consider the production of Parish Design Statements, or similar, which are suitable for use, by the Principle Authorities, as supplementary guidance

Houghton – Police Traffic unit area - 4000 drove over 30 mph with the majority being under 40 mph. 722 drivers exceeded 45 mph. The highest speed recorded was 70 mph.

PC Hughes said that in general drivers were not driving at excessive speeds but he was concerned at the large number of people driving between 30 and 40 mph in the area Police Traffic Unit on Houghton Road. He recommended flashing signs to remind drivers of the 30 mph limit.

Giving a Crime update PC Hughes reported continued Quad bike and Outhouse thefts in the area but that there had also been successful arrests and prosecutions recently.

The White Paper was built around the needs of people rather than organization. Benefits to Parish Councils included the extra power of "Well being" given to Quality Parishes allowing more discretion to respond to the concerns of residents. In regard to the issue of unitary authorities, Dr Gooding said that it had not been possible for the City Council to prepare a quality bid within government timescales.

The County bid for a Cumbria wide unitary authority was opposed as not being sensitive to providing services locally. It seemed that time was available to submit alternative bids and the City Council was now working with the other District Councils to that end.

Questions were raised issues concerning -

- Confusion of two tiers or more providing local services
- The opportunity for Quality Parish Councils
- The pros and cons of 6 District Councils supported say by regional Education and Social Services
- The uniqueness of Cumbria that could not be classed as a "place" rather a collection of discrete communities
- The positive relationship between Carlisle City Council and Parish Councils not mirrored elsewhere in the County
- The location of any County Unitary Authority Headquarters Penrith was rumoured
- The fear that services for children and young people in Carlisle would suffer in any efficiency drive

City Cllr M Bowman requested that Dr Gooding and his team be praised for their hard work in recent weeks and he was thanked for giving a clear view of the issues to the Council.

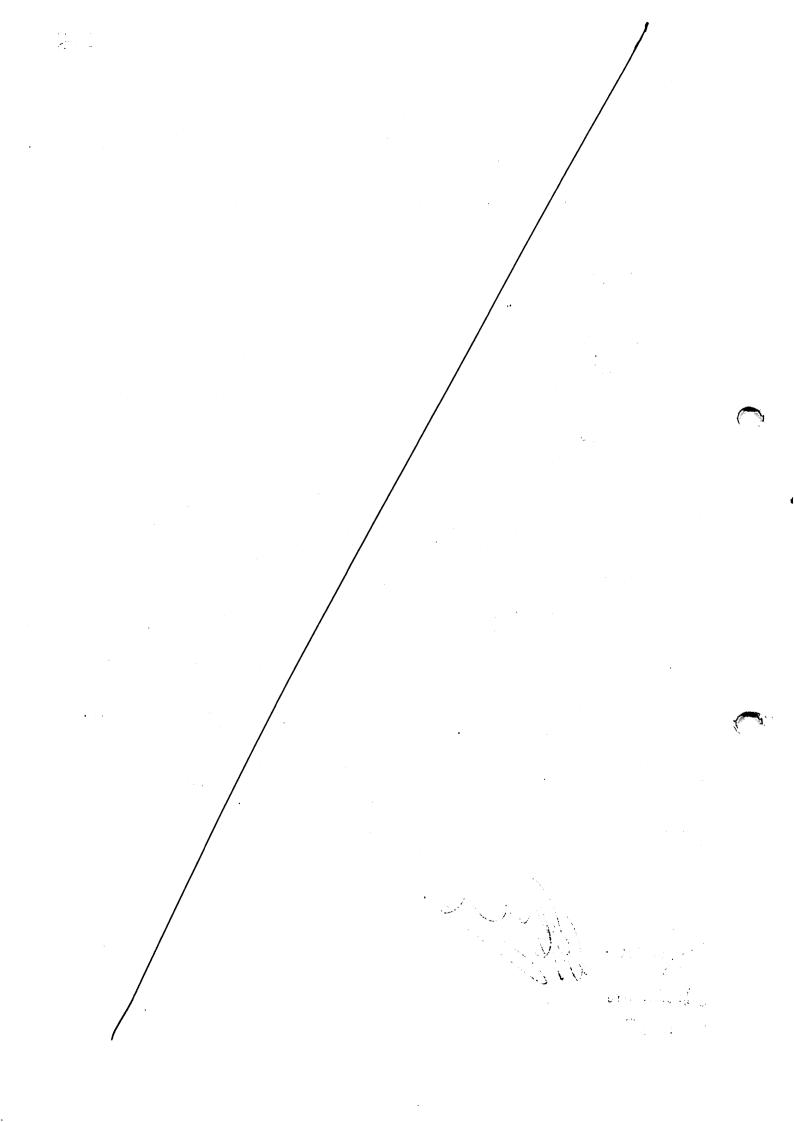

- 1. The Parish Council considers that an absolute maximum of 20 cars only may be allowable on the designated site.
- 2. Higher numbers of vehicles would constitute an over intensive use of the site.
- 3. The Council notes with great concern that since occupying the site the applicant has displayed considerably more than the currently permitted maximum number of vehicles i.e. 10. At present approximately 20+ vehicles occupy the proposal site,

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- others being displayed for sale at other points around the filling station including one, on a raised structure, at the Brampton Road entrance/exit.
- 4. The Parish Council urges that strict controls be included in any permissions which may be granted in respect of this application.

Appn 07/0276 Land adjacent to 7 the Nurseries, Linstock – Erection of a two storey dwelling (outline application). **Resolved to object** to the application on the following grounds-

- 5. The proposed site is in very close proximity to The Nurseries bio-disc. The boundary, edged red on the location plan, appears to encompass existing access to the disc. Any building work associated with the proposal may compromise the physical integrity of the bio disc site.
- 6. Use of the available space having been maximized, development in the area of The Nurseries has reached saturation; with the result that surface water and foul sewerage disposal networks are loaded to capacity.
- 7. The means of sewage disposal, which serves The Nurseries development, has also a very problematic history. The system often malfunctions, much to the distress of local residents. Any further increase in the daily loading could greatly exacerbate these problems.
- 8. It is believed that planning consent may have been refused in respect of an earlier application to develop the site.

Appn 07/0231 – Houghton Nursery – Variation of planning condition 12 ref Appn 05/0477 to allow for display of temporary buildings. **Resolved to object** to the application on the following grounds -

That the proposal:

- 1. would significantly prejudice the character and setting of the listed building
- 2. would have major detrimental impact upon the character of a defined woodland site
- 3. would severely prejudice the integrity of the wildlife habitat.
- 4. would constitute unacceptable major intensification of the use of the garden centre.
- 5. re-define the nature of the approval which was granted.
- 6. dilute adequate control regarding the nature and extent of the retail activities able to be conducted from the garden centre.
- 7. would have significant adverse impact upon local landscape character.
- 8. would be prejudicial to the visual environmental amenity of nearby residential property.
- 9. lacks toilet facilities, to the disadvantage of vulnerable social groups
- 10. may be conducive to criminal activity.
- Appn 07/0306 38 Jackson Road, Houghton Replacement of flat roof with pitched roof over bedroom /garage –Resolved to submit "no observations"
- Appn 07/0308 West House, Eden Grove, Crosby on Eden Installation of a conservatory —Resolved to submit "no observations"

The following permissions were noted -

- Appn 07/0049 18 Smithy Croft, Houghton Carlisle Single storey extension to provide enlarged kitchen and sitting room.
- Appn 07/0110 Woodside, Houghton Erection of Carport, replacement conservatory, front entrance porch and alterations to doors and windows

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SR184/04/07 Waste and Recycling

The Clerk reported a complaint from a resident that there was confusion in regard to the application of the City Council's Waste and Recycling; furthermore that there had been difficulty in contacting the published helpline. Several points were raised in the ensuing discussion

- There was a difference in opportunity for recycling as between the urban and rural areas of the parish.
- For urban residents the plastics and cardboard recycling bags were inadequate both in type and number
- More staff will be deployed to the help centre
- Some callers to the helpline were impolite
- There were bound to be teething problems when considering the extent of the change to 48000 homes in the District.
- Fines were not planned at present for errant residents
- Help was available to individuals with very specific problems

Resolved to accept the advice of City Cllr M Bowman that City Council Officers visit the resident to help with the problems raised and to seek to obtain better containers for plastics and cardboard.

SR185/04/07 Village matters

Houghton – Amenity Lighting , Smithy Croft – following complaints from a neighbouring resident it was resolved to seek further advice from the City Council lighting Engineer

Rickerby – Messrs Story Ltd, owners of the Paddock, had agreed to residents of Rickerby gaining emergency access to the paddock, given certain conditions. **Resolved** that the conditions as set out in their letter of 29th March be accepted.

SR186/04/07 Councillor matters

The following matters were raised-

Houghton – provision of speed indication equipment – It was noted that PC Hughes was seeking volunteers to manage and transport the devices that would be on semi permanent loan to the Parish.

Rickerby Park – although not within the parish several councillors were concerned about the amount of litter and the number of vehicles, including many 4x4's, crossing the grassed areas in the Park. Resolved that the Clerk write to the City Council.

SR187/04/07 Schedule of Correspondence, notices and publications

A schedule of correspondence, notices and publications since the last meeting was received and to noted.

SR188/04/07 Date of next meeting – the next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday 11th April 2007 at 7.30pm in Crosby Parish Hall, Crosby on Eden.

SR 189/04/07 Cllr W Wannop. The Chairman referred this being the last meeting attended by Cllr W Wannop before his retirement from the Parish Council after being in public life for 36 years. He thanked Cllr Wannop for his tremendous contribution and commitment to the local area and wished him well for the future. This was warmly endorsed by all those present. Cllr M Bowman also thanked Cllr Wannop on behalf of the City Council.
